We are nearing our fundraising goal - donate today!



The Oberlin Heritage Center Board of Trustees established the Pat Murphy Endowment for Heritage Preservation in May 2015 with the goal of raising \$1,000,000. Through donation and pledges, we have already raised \$935,000 and we hope to fully fund the endowment before the end of 2024. Once complete, the endowment will provide an annual distribution of \$50,000 to fund ongoing preservation projects of the buildings, grounds, and collections, protect them against the ravages of time, and help avoid future deferred maintenance challenges.

This year we have welcomed 8 new Endowed Life Members (ELMs / those who have contributed \$2,000 or more to OHC endowments) and 10 current ELMs who have upgraded to the next ELM level. We have received \$44,000 in donations and \$37,000 in pledges. At April's Annual Meeting, the Development Committee shared an update with those in attendance including a visual presentation on our Elm Tree "goal thermometer" (pictured). Development and Business Manager Bethany Hobbs announced a challenge grant of \$15,000 from her mother Eloise Pulsifer's estate to aid in the completion of this endowment. Bethany asked those present plus the community to donate what they can to match this gift and get OHC to the finish line. OHC is now \$65,000 from its \$1 million goal.

Oberlin Juneteenth 2024

Saturday, June 15 from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

This year, Juneteenth will be held at the George A. Abram Pavilion on Edison Street. Juneteenth programming will include a reading of the Emancipation Proclamation by Oberlin College alum Donnay Edmund, and comments by Dr. Mary Ann Harris. Children's activities and a live DJ will be offered all day along. Food vendors and other vendors will be on site for the celebration.

The Juneteenth Parade will take place at 12:00 p.m. and follow the same route as last year beginning at Spring Street Park and moving along Pleasant Street to the Roundhouse and the Pavilion on Edison Street. The parade will feature a band led by Oberlin College alum Daniel Spearman, horsemen, a clown, candy, dancers, and other fun features.

The Maafa commemoration will be held at Westwood Cemetery in Oberlin from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Daniel Spearman will play the trumpet for a rendition of 'Lift Every Voice and Sing.'

This event is hosted by Juneteenth Oberlin and OHC will be a participating vendor that day.

"A Higher Law" Showing at The Palace Theater in Lorain

Wednesday, June 19 at 6:00 p.m.

There will be a free screening of "A Higher Law: The Oberlin-Wellington Rescue of 1858" on Wednesday, June 19 at 6:00 p.m. at the Palace theater in downtown Lorain. The Rescue was a key event in the history of abolitionism leading up to the Civil War, when a group of 37 men were charged with violating the Fugitive Slave Act of 1850. This is the first time that a 'higher law' defense was used in a federal court case.



This screening is sponsored by the YWCA Elyria Racial Equity Center of Lorain County and Oberlin Heritage Center, in collaboration with Interfaith Ministries of Lorain County, Lorain County Section NCNW, Lorain Historical Society, Lorain Public Library, AKA Sorority, and MainStreet Lorain.

Teen Museum Summer Workshop

July 15-17 (Mon-Wed, 12:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.)



This three-day, behind-the-scenes workshop is designed for teens (grades 9-12) who are interested in community service, expanding their leadership and communication skills, and experiencing what it's like to work at a museum. Teens will learn techniques of greeting visitors, giving tours, teaching historic games, working with museum collections, and much more! Following completion of the workshop, participants are invited to volunteer with the Oberlin Heritage Center for various tours, special events, and programs as their schedules permit.

The fee is \$50 (\$45 for children and grandchildren of OHC members) with a \$25 reimbursement for students who complete at least 15 hours of volunteer service for OHC by the end of 2024.

This is a great opportunity to learn about local history, build up resumes and strengthen college applications, fulfill community service hours, and hang out with other students who have a passion for their communities.

This workshop will be led by OHC Museum Education & Tour Manager Amanda Manahan, who is eager to share the behind-the-scenes fun of being involved with a museum.

2024 Annual Meeting Recap




Sandstone Village Car and Bike Show on Sunday, June 2 at 11:00 a.m.
